


Plans Using Medicare Standards

Medicare In Perspective

- Medicare is not perfect
 - High levels of fraud
- Medicare offers reasonable reference point
 - Fully transparent
- Medicare provides fair basis for comparison

 Minimum expectations
- Medicare sets "de facto" market standard
 - Amplifies and maximizes plan leverage

Medicare Payment Standards

Claim Edits	Questionable Cases	Reference Files
NOTE: Requires license from AMA for CPT codes.		
Physician Correct Coding	Medically Unlikely	National Provider Identifier
Hospital Outpatient Correct Coding	Hospital Acquired Conditions	Provider Fraud Master File
Diagnoses and Procedure Edits	"Never" Events	Death Master File



Claim Edit #1

Physician Correct Coding

Construct "Encounters" (Same person/Same day/Same provider)

Compare Code Pairs (Column 1 and Column 2 codes can't be in same encounter)

Looks for mutually exclusion procedures, unbundling, up-coding, etc.

Claim Edit #2

Hospital Outpatient Correct Coding

Similar to Physician Correct Coding

But for Hospital Outpatient Departments

Claim Edit #3

Diagnoses and Procedure Code Edits

Similar to other tests but at the Claim Line Not Encounter Level

18 test areas

Questionable Cases #1

Medically Unlikely Events

Applies to Part B (professional) claims

Maximum number of units of service for same person/same day

Most public but some not.

NOT practice guidelines or recommended levels.

Questionable Cases #2

Hospital Acquired Conditions

10 categories

(E.g., foreign object left after surgery, blood incompatibility, care-related infections, pressure ulcers, etc.)

Creative coding an issue.

Non-payment may mean no care for problem.

Questionable Cases #3

Never Events

Similar to Hospital Acquired Conditions

(unambiguous, usually preventable, serious)

Controversial but few results

Reference File #1

National Provider Identifier

National Plan & Provider Enumeration System (NPPES)

Mandated for 2012

Good indicator of payer preparedness for new regulations

Reference File #2

Provider Fraud Master File

List of Excluded Individual Entities (LEIE)

ADDRESS not person

Needs verification to be sure it isn't a legit provider that shares an address with a provided convicted of fraud.

Death Master File

Social Security Administration Death File

Not 100% but good start
